



**Family Life Minister  
JOB DESCRIPTION**

Overview: The Family Life Minister is to serve as the point person in leading and carrying out consistent and intentional activities for the discipleship and growth of student and family ministries.

Principle Expectations:

1. Live an exemplary life under the authority of Jesus Christ.
2. Be committed to the Bible as inspired, inerrant and the authoritative Word of God.
3. Be committed to the concept of New Testament Christianity and the plea of the Restoration Movement.

Distinctive Responsibilities:

1. Provide leadership and serve as the point person in carrying out consistent, intentional activities for student and family ministry. (Specific activities include youth groups and 5<sup>th</sup> Quarters.)
2. Use your specific and God-given talents and abilities to further God's ministry in our communities.
3. Assist in conducting corporate Worship Services (Sunday AM and special occasions.)
4. Enlist, equip, encourage, empower and evaluate those desiring to become involved and those currently involved in Student Ministry leadership and teaching.
5. Teach adults, or students on an ongoing basis in Sunday school, Life Group or other activities.
6. Be involved in a discipleship and/or life group on an ongoing basis.
7. Be involved in community, student and families' lives, events and organizations.
8. Attend and provide monthly updates on ministry programs and projects to the Eldership.
9. Collaborate with ministry staff to create a calendar of student and family activities, sponsor responsibilities and training.
10. Create annual budget for areas of ministry responsibilities.
11. Responsible for keeping the congregation informed of specific ministry activities through announcements, posters, newsletters, website, weekly bulletins, and any other Church publications. Activities need to be announced in a timely manner.
12. Preach on an occasional basis.
13. Promote Central Iowa Bible Camp through attending and providing leadership to camp activities. Attend up to two weeks of camp per year.
14. Counseling is done in crisis situations only. Long-term counseling or counseling that involves therapy, hospitalization or legal complications is to be referred to a professional counselor.
